


To walk to the museum follow ------

The Museum experience provides learning opportunities in a new environment.

Learners will:

- Discover a Roman fort and its setting
- Find out about life (civilian and military) in Roman times
- > Explore ideas about how people lived in the past
- Encounter real Roman artefacts (some available for handling)
- Re-enact scenes from life in Roman times.
- Exercise a variety of skills, communicative and creative

The Museum's practitioners will take learners through activities in the Museum, using the whole building.

Packed lunches can be eaten in the Museum's education space or (weather permitting) in the outside picnic area.

After lunch there is a choice of craft activities based on the morning's work.

Loan boxes, including replicas and suggested follow-up activities are available to take away after your visit (free of charge).

Our team can devise programmes for learners at all levels. This is a Roman Museum but programmes for many subject areas are possible.

Teachers are recommended to arrange a free pre-visit to meet a member of the education team and undertake your own risk assessment. Please telephone to arrange a time.

How to book

We can accept bookings for a maximum of 45 children – groups must be accompanied by at least three adults.

Charges

Visit only 50p/child, teachers free

Half day including activities £1/child, teachers free

Full day (incl. workshop materials) £2/child, teachers free

To book a group visit telephone or email the museum with the following information: Name of school, preferred date of visit, name and telephone number of contact person, age and number of pupils, time of arrival.

There is a shop at the museum for reference books (including a good selection specifically for children) and also those essential pocket money purchases.
